<h2>Snitching is...</h2>	<h2>Reporting is...</h2>
<p>Telling an adult about something that doesn't cause harm to you or others.</p>	<p>Telling an adult about something that causes harm to you or someone else, or something that is likely to cause harm in the future</p>
<p>Telling an adult something about someone that doesn't cause harm but is possibly embarrassing.</p>	
<p>To get someone else in trouble and make yourself look good by comparison</p>	<p>To protect yourself, others, and the school community</p>
<p>It can be mean or selfish.</p>	<p>It shows advocacy, responsibility and integrity.</p>
<h2>Example....</h2>	<h2>Example...</h2>
<p>You see someone picking up a penny that someone had dropped on the floor. You tell the principal and say that you would turn in any found money because it's just the right thing to do.</p>	<p>You see someone being bullied in the hallway. You report it because you know that the person being bullied is hurting.</p>
<p>You see someone using snapchat during class and you are telling the principal to show that you know the rules and they do not.</p>	<p>You have noticed that your friend is really depressed lately. You are reporting it because you want to make sure your friend gets help.</p>
